<u>Councilman Venier</u> – Thank you to the YMCA for the inaugural event during the St. Patrick's Day celebrations. And was impressed how they re-routed the 5K run last minute, due to the flooded roads.

BOARD & COMMISSIONS REPORTS Airport Board Minutes Building Permits

VISITOR/PUBLIC COMMENT

Mason Hayenga voiced his concern regarding a neighbor who had their driveway cleared of snow and it was pushed into his front yard, curb, and sidewalk; with gravel, rocks, sticks and leaves. He also commented on snowmobile riders in town. They are disrespectful, driving through private property (backyards, between houses, on sidewalks, front yards across driveways). The snowmobile route signs could be improved. He realizes that these complaints come after the snow is gone, but would like consideration for fines, etc. for next year. He also suggested that a pub and grill with gambling machines should be put out at the airport. The proceeds from the gambling could pay for renovations and maintenance of the airport.

Purpose

The purpose of the public hearing is to obtain citizen comments and to review the results of the DCEO CDBG Public Infrastructure grant project. The City obtained a CDBG Public Infrastructure grant in the amount of \$219,467.00 to rehabilitate an existing water main on Palmyra Street (IL Route 2) from 1st Avenue to 4th Avenue.

Water Main Improvements and Project Cost

The existing 6" water main on Palmyra Street from 1st Avenue to 4th Avenue had experienced a significant number of breaks, which caused service to be temporarily interrupted to the 13 customers while the main was repaired. The water main improvements included the cleaning, televising and lining of 852 feet of 6" water main, construction of 123 feet of 12" water main, 160 feet of 6" water main, (3) new fire hydrants, (12) new gate valves and surface restoration work.

The final project cost is \$455,730.41 as detailed in the table below. The DCEO CDBG grant paid for \$219,467.00 of the final project cost and the City paid \$236,263.41 toward the project.

Low to Moderate Income (LMI) Benefit

The benefit to low-to-moderate income persons for this project was 83.8%, which was determined by a door to door income survey. Of the \$219,467.00 DCEO CDBG grant, \$183,913.35 directly benefited low-to-moderate income individuals.

Displacement of Individuals

The project did not displace any individuals in the project area.

ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 5, CHAPTER 8A OF THE DIXON CITY CODE (DOOR TO DOOR SOLICITATION)

WHEREAS, the City Code of the City of Dixon provides for the licensing and regulation of door to door solicitation; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council find it necessary to amend Section 5-8A of the Dixon City Code to serve the City of Dixon's grave interest in preventing 1) crime, 2) the perpetration of fraudulent business practices, and 3) intrusion upon the privacy and sanctity of its citizens' homes and families.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Dixon as follows:

SECTION 1: The above recitals and findings are hereby made a part of this Ordinance as if incorporated herein.

SECTION 2: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-2 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended to read as follows:

"LICENSE REQUIRED: It shall be unlawful for any person or organization to engage in commercial door to door solicitation in the City of Dixon without first securing a license as herein provided. If an organization employs or otherwise engages one or more individuals for such activities, each such individual and the organization shall be required to separately apply and be licensed hereunder."

- **SECTION 3**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-3 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (A)1. to read as follows:
- "(A)1. The name, home and business address, date of birth, sex and a physical description of the individual applicant, including, but not limited to, height, weight, hair color, and eye color; the name, address, telephone number, and email address of the organization applicant and the name, telephone number, and email address of each of the organization applicant's officers, directors, and owners;"
- **SECTION 4**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-3 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (A)5. to read as follows:
- "(A)5. The date(s) of all previous application(s), including all previous applications submitted by individuals employed by or otherwise soliciting on behalf of an organization applicants, under any name, current or former, for license under this section;"

- **SECTION 5**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-3 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (A)6. to read as follows:
- "(A)6. Whether a license issued to the applicant under this section, including a license granted to an individual employed by or otherwise soliciting on behalf of an organization applicant, under any name, current or former, has ever been revoked;"
- **SECTION 6**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-3 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (A)7. to read as follows:
- "(A)7. Whether the applicant, or any individual having obtained a license under this section while in the employ or otherwise soliciting on behalf of an organization applicant, under any name, current or former, has ever been convicted of a violation of any provisions of this section, or the ordinance of any other municipality or any Illinois statute regulating such activities;"
- **SECTION 7**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-3 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (A)8. to read as follows:
- "(A)8. Whether the applicant, or any individual having obtained a license under this section or under a similar provision of any other municipality or Illinois statute while in the employ or otherwise soliciting on behalf of an organization applicant, under any name, current or former, has ever been convicted of the commission of a felony under the laws of any state or under federal law, and if so, the offense and date of conviction;"
- **SECTION 8**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-3 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by the addition of subsection (A)11., which reads as follows:
- "(A)11. Documentary evidence that the organization applicant is authorized to do business in the State of Illinois by proof of registration with the Illinois Office of the Secretary of State."
- **SECTION 9**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-3 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (C) to read as follows:

"(C) Denial of License:

1. Individuals: No license shall be issued to any person who has been convicted of the commission of a felony under the laws of the State of Illinois or of any other state or federal law within five (5) years of the date of the application, or who has been found to be in violation of any of the provisions of this section or whose license issued hereunder has previously been revoked, or who submits an incomplete or inaccurate application.

- 2. Organizations: No license shall be issued to any organization which has been convicted of the commission of a felony under the laws of the State of Illinois or of any other state or federal law within (5) years of the date of the application, or which has been, or the employees or individuals otherwise soliciting on behalf of which have been, found to be in violation of any of the provisions of this section or to which the licenses issued hereunder, to the organization or those individuals in its employ or otherwise soliciting on its behalf, have previously been revoked, or which submits an incomplete or inaccurate application."
- **SECTION 10**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-8 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by the addition of subsection (C), which reads as follows:
- "(C) Licenses issued to organizations under the provisions of this chapter may be revoked by the Mayor of the City, after notice of hearing and an opportunity to be heard, for any of the forgoing causes, whether resulting from the conduct of the organization itself or that of its employees or those individuals soliciting on the organization's behalf."
- **SECTION 11**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-10 of the City Code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (A)2. to read as follows:
- "(A)2. It shall be unlawful for any person to go in or upon any residence or nonresidential premises for the purpose of conducting any form of solicitation at any time after seven o'clock (7:00) P.M. or before nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. on any Monday through Saturday, or at any time on Sunday, or at any time on any holiday recognized by the State of Illinois, unless such solicitation has been requested by the owner or occupant of such premises."
- **SECTION 12**: That Title 5, Chapter 8A, Section 5-8A-11 of the City code of the City of Dixon be amended by amending subsection (A) to read as follows:
- "(A) A person who shall violate any provision of this chapter, including those offenses enumerated in Section 5-8A-8(A), shall be fined an amount not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for each such violation."
- **SECTION 13**: In all other respects, Title 5, Chapter 8A of the City Code of the City of Dixon shall remain in full force and effect as previously adopted and/or amended.
- **SECTION 14**: The provisions and sections of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be separable, and the invalidity of any portion of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remainder.
- **SECTION 15**: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.
 - **SECTION 16**: The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.







#### OPTION FOR EASEMENT

For and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and no/100 (\$500.00) (hereinafter the "Option Consideration") the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the CITY OF DIXON, an Illinois municipal corporation ("Owner"), does hereby give and grant unto UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, a Delaware corporation (hereinafter called "Optionee"), the sole, exclusive and irrevocable option during the period commencing with the date hereof and ending April 30, 2019 (hereinafter the "Option Period") to acquire a (i) perpetual easement ("Easement") for Optionee's construction, operation, use, and maintenance of a drainage pipeline and related appurtenances ("Pipeline") on 0.057 acres, more or less, by Easement Deed, and (ii) temporary construction easement ("TCE") for Optionee's ingress to and egress from the Property (defined below), as well as for general work space needed to construct the Pipeline as more particularly described herein, for the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and no/100 (\$2,500.00) (hereinafter the "Total Consideration") to be paid as hereinafter provided, on the real estate located in Lee County, Illinois, further described as Exhibit A, hereto attached and hereby made a part hereof (hereinafter the "Property"). Owner and Optionee agree that the real property subject to the TCE is generally identified by a blue line and labeled "Temporary Work Space" and "Access Route" on the print dated March 12, 2019, attached hereto as **Exhibit C** and made a part hereof ("TCE Property").

It is understood that the Property has not had a final survey completed by Optionee but that the Optionee may conduct a final survey and will prepare a metes and bounds description for use in the Easement Deed. At Closing, the Total Consideration shall be adjusted on a Pro-Rata basis (both upwards & downwards) to account for any discrepancy in size between the Property as shown on **Exhibit A** and the completed survey.

Said option shall be exercised by written notice to the Owner from the Optionee at any time within the Option Period. Notice shall be properly given or made if in writing and delivered or mailed, first class, postage prepaid, to the Owner at 121 West 2nd Street, Dixon, IL 61021, ATTN: Matthew Heckman, Assistant City Manager.

In the event this option is exercised, the Owner and Optionee shall agree upon a time and place for closing this transaction, but in any event, such closing shall take place on or before ninety (90) days after the exercise of such option.

This option is given with the understanding that upon its exercise by said Optionee the Owner will execute and deliver to the Optionee a good and sufficient Easement Deed, in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit B**, conveying the Property to the Optionee, its successors and assigns, free and clear of all encumbrances.

Upon the execution and delivery to the Optionee of the Easement Deed, the Optionee will pay to the Owner the Total Consideration, less the Option Consideration which was paid to the Owner upon the execution of this option.

The Owner hereby grants to the Optionee the right immediately to enter upon and use the Property for the purpose of constructing railroad improvements, and including, at Optionee's sole discretion, investigation of any and all matters in connection with the Property, including without limitation, conducting Phase I and Phase II investigations of the physical and environmental condition of the Property and conducting feasibility studies and such other examinations as Optionee may deem desirable. In the event the Optionee does not elect to acquire the Easement on the Property within the Option Period, then, and in that event, Optionee will repair any damage to the Property caused by Optionee.

Owner agrees that the payment of the Total Consideration and the performance of the other obligations of Optionee under this option are intended to be the entire compensation to Owner for the acquisition of the Property. Owner waives and releases Optionee from any and all claims for compensation (including, without limitation, severance damages, relocation expenses, and loss of goodwill) and any and all other rights under the eminent domain laws of the State of Illinois that Owner may have in connection with the acquisition of the Property under this option. This release and waiver does not include Optionee's express obligations under this option.

The negotiations relative to this option have been carried on by both parties without the intervention of any person, which would give rise to any valid claim against either of the parties hereto for brokerage commission or other like payment. Each party hereto shall indemnify and hold harmless the party against and from any and all claims for brokerage commission of other like payment arising out of the transactions contemplated by this option and occasioned by the actions of such indemnifying party.

If this option is not exercised, the Owner shall retain the Option Consideration in full and complete satisfaction of all damages sustained by the Owner, it being understood that the option for the Easement on the Property rests entirely with the Optionee and that there is no agreement for the Easement on the Property unless and until the aforesaid option is exercised as hereinabove provided. The Optionee shall have the right to assign this option in whole or in part and, in the event of such assignment, the term "Optionee" wherever used herein shall, as appropriate, be taken to mean the assignee named in such assignment.

This option shall be binding upon the Owner and the heirs, administrators, executors, successors and assigns of the Owner.

#### **Special Provisions:**

Owner hereby grants, conveys, and confirms unto Optionee, its successors and assigns, the TCE in, to over, along, upon, and across the TCE Property shown on Exhibit C, for the sole purpose of Optionee's, its employees', agents', contractors', and permittees' ingress to and egress from the Property, as well as for general work space needed for Optionee's construction, operation, use, maintenance, repair, relocation, or removal of the Pipeline on the Property, as well as for other general railroad activities associated with Optionee's use and operation of a railroad bridge adjacent to the Property. The TCE granted herein shall commence on the date this agreement is executed by Owner and continue until the earlier of: (i) the date upon which Optionee completes all of its construction activities associated with the Pipeline; or (ii) a period of one (1) year from the date of this agreement ("TCE Term"). Consideration for the TCE has been factored into and included in the Purchase Price stated above, and Optionee shall not be required to pay any additional amounts for the TCE. Optionee agrees to restore the TCE Property following the TCE Term to a condition reasonably similar to what existed prior to the commencement of use thereof by Optionee.

By its acceptance of this instrument, Optionee agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Owner from and against any and all loss, damages, costs and expenses which may result from injury to or death of persons or loss of or damage to property when such loss is due to or arises in connection with or as a result of Optionee's construction of the Pipeline and use of the TCE Property as contemplated by this agreement, except to the extent that such loss is caused by the gross negligence of Owner.

The foregoing paragraph shall survive the Closing and shall not be merged into any instrument or conveyance delivered at the Closing.

#### EASEMENT DEED

CITY OF DIXON, an Illinois municipal corporation ("Grantor"), does hereby grant and convey to UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, a Delaware corporation ("Grantee"), its successors and assigns, a PERPETUAL, EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT ("Easement") in, to, over, along, upon, under, and across the real property located in Lee County, State of Illinois, described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof ("Property"), together with the right of ingress and egress to and from the Property, for Grantee's installation, operation, use, maintenance, repair, and replacement of one (1) drainage pipeline and any appurtenances related thereto (collectively, "Pipeline"), as is required to protect a railroad bridge located on, over, and across Grantee's right-of-way adjacent to the Property ("Grantee's Right-of-Way"), and if and when necessary, Grantee's removal of any personal property of Grantee, including but not limited to the Pipeline, from the Property.

Grantor acknowledges that Grantee, its employees, agents, contractors, and permittees (collectively, "Grantee Parties") will be accessing and using the Property for the purposes set forth herein. Such use by the Grantee Parties will be performed under the terms and conditions of this Easement Deed.

The Easement shall run with and be appurtenant to and for the benefit of Grantee's Right-of-Way (and each and every parcel into which it may be divided) as the dominant tenement and shall be a burden upon the Property as the servient tenement.

Except to the extent any (i) damages to the Pipeline are caused by the acts or omissions of Grantor, its successors and and assigns, or (ii) repairs to the Pipeline are required as a result of Grantor's acts or omissions, by its acceptance of this Easement Deed, Grantee, its successors and assigns, agrees to maintain and repair the Pipeline across, on, over, under, and upon the Property at Grantee's expense.

Grantor, for itself, its successors and assigns, covenants with Grantee, its successors and assigns, that Grantor has the full power and lawful authority to grant and convey the Easement. Grantor also covenants with Grantee that Grantor will warrant and defend Grantee's title to the Easement in, to, over, along, upon, under, and across the Property against the claims of all persons.

Grantee agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Grantor from and against losses, damages, costs and expenses ("Losses") which may result from injury to or death of persons or loss of or damage to property when such Losses are caused by Grantee's use of the Easement pursuant to this Easement Deed, except to the extent that the Losses are caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of Grantor.
